Descendants of King John "Lackland" of England (1167-1216) - A derelict, short upright tower stands near Mount Pleasant Farm of the edge of an escarpment at an elevation of 307 feet. This is the remains of a type of primitive, shorter, parallel-sided windmill (similar to ones across the channel in Somerset).
